The City of Delray Beach Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) has a training program in disaster preparedness offered by Delray Beach Fire Rescue twice a year.

Team members learn basic medical operations, light search and rescue, disaster fire suppression and many other useful skills. This program is coordinated through the Fire Department, under the leadership of Firefighter/Paramedic Kenneth Thompson.

Class instruction, materials and equipment are free. The program consists of 24 hours of classroom instruction and hands on activities one night a week from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM. Classes are taught by trained professionals. Graduates of the program have no obligation on completion.

The information acquired from the CERT program is invaluable, since a disaster could occur at any time.

So far, through January 15, 2020, 68 new deeds were recorded in Palm Beach County for Rainberry Bay, including Riviera Drive. These include purchases by investors who have not turned over the property and banks who have taken back their properties.

The majority of purchasers are new neighbors. We had residents who downsized and residents who upsized but activity was good this year.

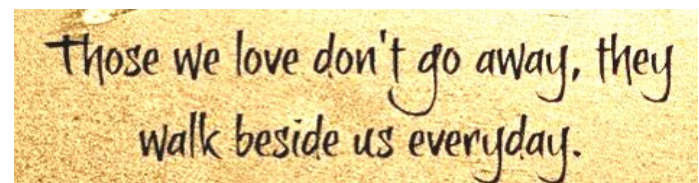

Please join me in thanking our hard-working Nominating/Search Committee: **LAURA COTE, HELEN FRAUMENI, RAY GERSON, JOYCE MARCHETTE, DAVE SAKS AND MARVIN WOLMER** led by their **CHAIR, DEB PETERS**, for their hard work and many interviews these past couple of months.

As of the January 22nd deadline for submission of Intent to Run forms to the office for vetting, the Nominating Committee submitted the following:

- ◆ 2 openings for the Master Board: 3 people have declared their intent to be a candidate.
- ◆ 2 openings for the Homes Board: 3 people have declared their intent to be a candidate.
- ◆ 1 opening for the Villas Board: 1 person has declared their intent to be a candidate.
- ◆ An incumbent is considering running again and has until Candidates' Night, January 29, to declare.

The personal statements of each of the declared candidates will be found on the following pages. Thank you in advance for your pledge to serve our community. On Candidates' Night, January 29th, their job will be complete and the Election Committee will go to work.

On Wednesday, March 4, we will have the Rainberry Residents' Annual Meeting and Election.

On behalf of the community, we would like to thank the current Board for their service as we say goodbye to Villas Treasurer **TED CANNON** and Master Vice President, **ALAN MILNER** for fulfilling their terms of service. Current Board members who have chosen to declare their candidacy for another term are **ROBERT COHEN**, Masters, and **JOE ZOOB**, Homes. The remaining four board members are: **LOIS WIESLER**, Masters **KAREN CLOUSER**, Homes, **STEPHANIE BRAUNSTEIN** and **CHERYL CRUTCHFIELD**, Villas.

The candidates who have declared their intention to run during this election are introduced to you in the February Beacon in their own words and again in the Election Packet you will receive shortly. [For details, see Disclaimer on page 8.] The Master Association Board has two openings and three qualified contenders for the seats, **ROBERT COHEN**, **DAVID KULICK** and **JAMES WALSH**. The Homes Board has 2 seats available and three contenders: **EUGENE ENGLESE**, **JAMES MORIARITY** and **JOE ZOOB**. The Villas Board has one opening and one candidate: **RAYMOND CLAYTON**.

PLEASE BE SURE TO VOTE. You will be receiving your Election Packet in early February. Please be certain you know who the registered voter in your household is (call the Office if you have a question). Any household with two or more deeded owners including married couples, needs to declare the household voter on a signed Certificate of Appointment of Voting Representative. You may pick up one in the office. Only one vote per household, no matter how many deeded owners.

If you are not planning to come to the Annual Meeting Election, please sign and fill out the enclosed proxy white envelope. Do not sign the ballot, only the outside of the envelope. This allows us to determine when we reach a quorum for each election. Cast the appropriate ballot for the Master Association and the Homes Association. Mark your two (2) choices on each and place your ballot in the enclosed white envelope. Mail in or place the signed envelope in the locked Ballot Box in the Management office. Signed envelopes are counted for quorum and marked "Received" on a registration list. All legitimate absentee ballots will be opened and counted by our Election Committee Counters at the Election and the results will be announced that night. All absentee ballots **MUST** be in by 12:00 noon of Election Day.

Actual registration and voting will begin at 6:30 pm on March 4 in the Theater and votes will be tallied there. When you come to the Theater to vote, bring a government-issued ID. You will register your name and address with our team of Registrars and be given a ballot by the Registrar. Vote and deposit your ballot in the appropriate, locked ballot box. Duplicates will invalidate both ballots.

The 2020-21 Board of Directors will meet immediately after election results are tabulated and announced for the initial business of selecting officers. Thank you in advance for attending to the most important business required of you as a resident of Rainberry Bay. Make your vote count and attend Board meetings regularly for important community information.

Ann and I have been homeowners in Rainberry Bay since the end of 2009.

I have over 50 years of engineering experience in building systems. I was the responsible design engineer for over 400 projects of commercial and

government buildings.

My formal education and work experience is:

- Bettis Reactor Engineering School, West Mifflin, PA - 1968
- Engineer - US Navy and AEC and US Department of Energy - 1967 to 1981
- Software quality assurance consultant to US Navy and US Patent and Trademark Office (PTO) - 1981 to 1999
- Since 1976 owner of engineering business providing design services for mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems for commercial buildings and custom homes.

I worked with others to organize the Rainberry Bay Capital Improvements Technical Oversight Committee (CITOC).

I was elected to the Master Board of Rainberry Bay in March of 2018 and have attempted to provide meaningful service to Rainberry Bay. I have served as the Master Treasurer both of my years on the Board.

I attended seminars at the Community Association Expo and received certificates for Homeowner Association Board Member Certification and Legal Updates in 2017, 2018 and 2019.

I am currently a member of the City of Delray Beach Board of Adjustment.

I want to see:

- complete openness of all Rainberry Bay governance
- serious quantitative oversight of all contracts and contractors
- review by technically qualified independent persons of all contracted work

Mike Glasser asked in Raindrops if anyone would take over his job of recording the board meetings so I started doing that – which made sense because I think it's important to go to board meetings and I might as well record them, and I've missed very few. Recording the meetings led to having to upload them to the website so now I'm on the communications committee and working to develop our new website. I've worked on a lot of apps and websites in my time.

I didn't intend to get involved in Theater management, but I've always enjoyed going to concerts and even once took a course in recording studio technology, so I found myself working the spotlights and helping our soundman Kenny set up and break down the sound equipment for the shows. With Kenny moving on to other things, I ended up doing much of the sound work along with Ron Lemoine and both of us working with Mort on the rest of the theater stuff. I also show the Sunday night movies and Friday afternoon operas and ballets.

I figured that being fairly able-bodied, I should help out in the event of a hurricane or other disaster, so I joined CERT and took the lessons at the firehouse and am ready to assist if needed. I'm also President of the tennis club and council of clubs and assist Irv Schulman in the clubhouse.

I set up the computer and high speed scanner for the Archive committee, and have done a fair amount of the scanning of old board minutes and documents. One of the more difficult parts of that job is the tendency to stop and read the minutes. Believe me, nothing much has changed over time. People have always been complaining about the irrigation, landscaping, and management, and many of those complaints are valid.

I'm pretty knowledgeable about how things are done at Rainberry and we face some significant issues as an older community so maybe I can help somewhat. I do plan on them carrying me out of Rainberry in a box so I might as well make the best of it while I'm here.

Rainberry Bay is an HOA (Home Owners Association) Community.

One of the responsibilities of a Rainberry Bay Board member is to educate the community. I frequently hear this question: "What does it mean to own property in a community governed by a Home Owners Association (HOA)?" The Many residents are unclear about the role of the entities that constitute the HOA. The following information should help clarify the issue. The HOA Board and the HOA Management Company are two separate entities. Our Board has nine (9) elected volunteers who own homes in Rainberry Bay. Our management company is an outside vendor hired by the Board.

What is the role of our HOA Board?

The Rainberry Bay Home Owners Association Board has two main duties:

- To act as a fiduciary for our non-profit Rainberry Bay Homeowners Association, Inc. That is, those nine individuals are entrusted with making the decisions that affect the value of the properties in the community. Five must agree for any motion or action to proceed. **One of the Board's primary responsibilities is to protect, preserve, and enhance the value of the physical property governed by the community association.**
- To facilitate the enjoyment of the community. That means setting the rules and regulations for residential conduct, for use of common spaces, for landscaping standards and anything else that affects the overall residential environment.

What is the role of our HOA Management Company?

They act as fiduciary agents of our HOA corporation and have two core duties:

- To provide helpful business advice. Our HOA Management Company should be offering unbiased direction and recommendations to help Rainberry Bay make the most prudent and effective decisions to preserve and enhance the value of our property.
- To implement the Board's decisions and facilitate day to day operations. While our Rainberry Bay Board establishes the rules for the community, our management company should be implementing those rules. This can range from issuing notices for minor infractions to acquiring independent bids for service providers.

Just as you would trust your lawyer, accountant, portfolio manager or any another fiduciary, so should Rainberry property owners be able to trust their board and property management company. Our real estate investment—our homes/villas— is often one of our most valuable assets. Choose wisely when casting your vote.

I am running for the HOMES Board as I believe I'm the right person for the job of getting our community back on track.

My background is in electro-mechanical engineering. As a college student, I owned my own pool insulation, pump, and filter repair company. Throughout my career, I worked in factories in Korea, China, Taiwan, Puerto Rico, Brazil, Italy and the U.S. setting up line production for various products. After marriage, my wife and I owned and operated Terra Nova Restaurant, in NYC.

We are now in our 8th year at Rainberry and as everyone knows, the degeneration of the grounds is evident. At the beginning of 2017, I began going to the Wednesday meetings and expressing my concerns to the Board. The board members at the time defended Friedman's management skills. He wrote an article for the April 2017 edition of The Beacon where he refuted my claims and stated that the landscapers were not responsible to maintain or replace sod that is installed by others."

We live at 2510 Riviera Drive. I took over the maintenance of my lawn, resumed fertilizing, watering and now maintain a green, weed free lawn.

Over the past 3 years I believe I have collected enough material to hold those responsible accountable for the millions of dollars of damage to our lawns. Mark is a manager with the respect of our community, that is not the issue. It is his predecessor that destroyed our ground cover.

If elected, I will push a case against the management and landscape companies to hold them financially responsible for the damage to what we once considered to be a beautiful community.

We are all concerned about the quality of the maintenance and landscaping here at Rainberry Bay. Previous board of directors allowed previous management companies to become involved in the re-roofing and repainting programs, which result in a series of problems.

During my previous stints on the Homes Board and Committees, I was instrumental in regaining control over the re-roofing and repainting programs. We established the current long-term plan for the re-roofing and repainting programs to reduce the number of roofing issues, facilitated emergency repairs, established standards for fascia replacement, and set up the reimbursement system that has helped us to maintain the excellent relationships with Roofing and Gisondi Painting contractors. This has enabled us to address problems quickly and efficiently because the management companies have not been involved with those issues.

As a result of these policies, our homes are in good repair. Unfortunately, the landscaping, roads, sidewalks, pools and irrigation systems are not in good repair because the responsibility for managing those features of the community have been left in the hands of the management companies. The Homes Board needs to use their Financial Muscle (62.7%) of all Masters funding to get what we need.

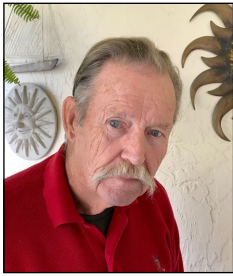
We need to apply the same strong controls over these functions that the Homes Board maintains on those services that the Homes control. As a member of the Homes Board, I will be in a position to do two things: maintain the budgeting system we created for the Homes Board, and insure that the Homes Association is not overcharged for the cost of services that have been authorized by the Masters Board.

As an ex officio member of the Masters Board, I will work to create the same levels of accountability and control for landscaping by working to separate the landscaping contract from the management contract, making sure that we are getting the landscaping services we need on budget and when we need them, and by developing and implementing a realistic, affordable ten year plan for the restoration and maintenance of the roads, common areas and irrigation systems similar to the highly effective programs for re-roofing and repainting.

I am a full-time resident of Rainberry Bay. I am deeply committed to restoring this community to its previous condition, but I need your help to do this.

If you want sound fiscal management, and strong physical management, along with a management that is responsive to your needs, then elect me to be your representative on the Homes board of directors.

The course covers the following subjects:

WEEK 1: INTRODUCTION TO CERT TRAINING/DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

- ◆ Course review, content and scheduling. Introduction to disasters, Meteorology 101, impact of disasters on infrastructures.

WEEK 2: DISASTER FIRE SUPPRESSION

- ◆ Identifying and reducing potential fire hazards, fire extinguisher use, fire suppression strategy, firefighting resources, firefighting techniques.

WEEK 3: DISASTER MEDICAL OPERATIONS - PART I

- ◆ Treatment strategies for life threatening conditions and principles of triage.

WEEK 4: DISASTER MEDICAL OPERATIONS - PART II

- ◆ Basic First Aid, Head to toe assessments, treatment for head wounds, treatment for fractures, sprains, burns and other injuries.

WEEK 5: LIGHT SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATIONS

- ◆ Search / Rescue priorities and resources, rescuer safety. Techniques for size- up and search. Cribbing and removing lightly trapped victims.

WEEK 6 DISASTER PSYCHOLOGY AND TEAM ORGANIZATION

- ◆ The post-disaster emotional environment. The Incident Command System, CERT strategies, tactics and documentation.

WEEK 7: TERRORISM / DISASTER COMMUNICATIONS

- ◆ Define Terrorism; identify actions to take before, during and following a suspected terrorist incident. Emergency communications and procedures.

WEEK 8 COURSE REVIEW/DISASTER SIMULATION EXERCISE/ GRADUATION

- ◆ Spring 2020 Training starts on Tuesday evening, April 14, at 6:00 pm, at the Delray Beach Fire Department Headquarters, 501 West Atlantic Ave., Delray Beach.

REVOLTS, GODS & GHOSTS

Giuseppe Verdi was the greatest composer of operas in the Italian language, and Richard Wagner was the greatest in the German language. In February we offer operas from both – Verdi's *Don Carlo* and Wagner's *Die Walküre* – as well as the beloved ballet *Giselle*.

Based on the life of the son of Phillip II of Spain, *Don Carlo* contains some of Verdi's most gorgeous and stirring music, as befitting this tale of doomed love and the battle for independence. An ardent advocate of Italy's fight for unification, Verdi surely felt an affinity for the Low Countries' fight to throw off the Spanish yoke. And as someone with an open disdain for organized religion, he would have enjoyed the opportunity to portray the Spanish Inquisition ("Nobody expects the Spanish Inquisition!") as the rapacious, satanic organization that it was.

Wagner's *Die Walküre* is the second opera in his monumental tetralogy *The Ring of the Nibelungen*. It is also the most human and approachable of the Ring operas, and in the abridged version we'll present (slightly over 2 hours), it is shorter than many Italian operas, including *Don Carlo*. The final scene of *Die Walküre*, in which the king of the gods, Wotan, prepares to punish his beloved daughter, Brünnhilde, is unforgettable, both dramatically and musically (especially in the version we'll be screening).

See you on February 18th and March 4th. Please make attending our Homes Board Meetings one of your New Year's Resolutions.

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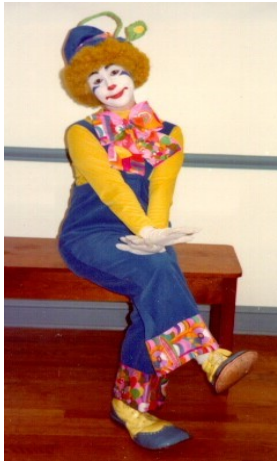
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MEET YOUR NEIGHBORS .. LINDA MAC NEAL

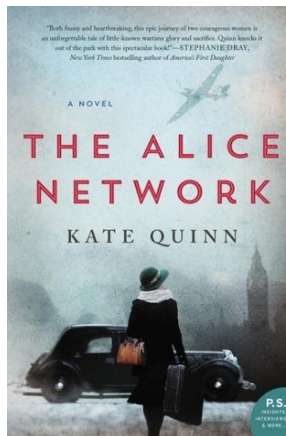

Chanin, as the regulars know him, went on to become a restaurateur in Boston before heading to sunny South Florida with his treasure trove of authentic recipes.

And are we ever grateful for his contribution to the local Asian scene? Indeed, we are! Chanin left Boston to seek a warmer climate, and what he brought us is a hot new restaurant with dishes, unlike anything you've experienced – anywhere!

And the many Yelp reviewers cannot be wrong. Alexi Y. writes, "This Shrimp Pad Thai is one of the best ones in the Delray area. Always have leftovers because it's such a big portion." A 5-star review by Louis F. calls Shiitake, a "Wonderful Experience!"



Mild-hearted? Try the Pad Thai. Thai-style pasta with peanuts, egg, bean sprouts, and scallions. Toss in your favorite protein like chicken (\$13.95), shrimp (\$14.95), or sea scallops (\$19.95) for an extra unique main course.



One of the menu favorites is the Baked Stuffed Lobster Tail (\$12.95). Made with fresh Maine lobster, this appetizer from the sushi bar is made with enoki

mushrooms, tobiko, scallop, kanikama, and Chanin's special sauce, topped with scallions and Japanese spices. Creamy and delicious, it is large enough to share.

The Salmon Avocado Ball (\$9.95) is another excellent starter. Ripe Hass avocados are chopped and made into a delectable salad and then wrapped in seared salmon and topped with spicy mayo, sweet soy, and ikura. A must try!



Entrees are equally unique and are large enough to share. Order several for the table. A popular dish

amongst regulars is the Crispy Duck with Indonesian Rice (\$21.95). The duck is crunchy on the outside and juicy throughout. Served on authentically seasoned rice bursting with the aromas of garlic, chili, and spices, then drizzled in basil sauce.

Many Thai dishes start with noodles. Chanin created his Hot and Crazy Noodles to tempt your palate and heat up your dining experience. 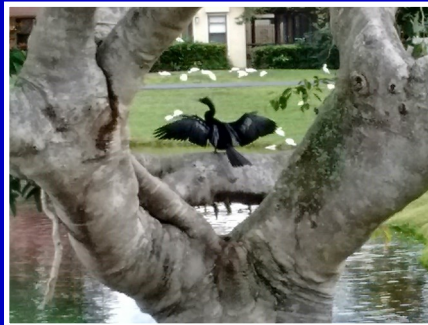

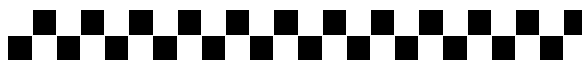

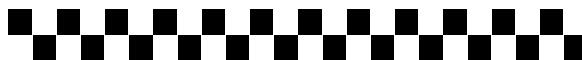

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REUSE, REPURPOSE . . .

Ketchup is cheap, effective and above all it's eco-friendly.

- Shine copper and silverware with ketchup. Tomato ketchup is a surprisingly effective cleaning agent and it's great for shining brass, copper and silverware. Some people claim ketchup is even more effective if you mix it with Worcestershire Sauce.
- Hair Conditioner
Ketchup is a great conditioner too, putting natural oils back into the hair.
- Reuse the squeezable ketchup bottle.
Clean the bottle out, and fill it with pancake mixture, or icing. The ketchup bottle enables you to squeeze small, perfectly formed pancakes directly onto the frying pan or griddle. It also makes it incredibly easy to add icing toppings to cakes and cupcakes. It's a lot easier to use this type of bottle than an icing nozzle.
- Freeze ketchup packets to soothe grazes.
It's cheaper and smaller than a gel ice pack and has the same effect of numbing ache and pains.



- Use ketchup to shine your car and alloys
You can use ketchup to clean the tarnish from car parts. In a similar vein to cleaning silver and copper, ketchup is great for shining up your alloys, and adding sheen to car metal in general. Good Housekeeping notes that ketchup isn't great for removing dirt, so you'd be best to clean the car first and use ketchup to add shine.
- Use ketchup as a great steak marinade
Most people don't realize how effective ketchup is as a base in recipes. This ketchup-based marinade for steak or chicken is an ideal preparation for a barbeque. You mix the ketchup with onion, vinegar, water and Worcestershire sauce then soak the steak or chicken in it for eight hours.

If you want to keep your ketchup around for longer, then you should keep it in the fridge. Ketchup lasts for around one month in the cupboard, versus six months in the refrigerator.

TABLE TENNIS: BRIEF HISTORY

Table Tennis was invented in England in the early 20th century and was originally called "Ping-Pong," a trade name. The name "Table Tennis" was adopted in 1921-22. The *Fédération Internationale de Tennis de Table* (International Table Tennis Federation) founded in 1926, had

members from England, Sweden, Hungary, India, Denmark, Germany, Czechoslovakia, Austria and Wales. By the mid-1990s more than 165 national associations were members.

The first world championships were held in London in 1926. Until 1939 the game was dominated by players from central Europe, the men's team event being won nine times by Hungary and twice by Czechoslovakia. In the mid-1950s however, Asia became the leading nation for Ping-Pong champions. In 1980 Guo Yuehua of China won the \$12,500 first prize in the first World Cup. Table tennis became an Olympic sport in 1988, with singles and doubles competition for men and women.

Club play is in the Clubhouse Auditorium on Monday and Wednesday from 12:00 PM to 2:00 PM and Friday from 10:00AM to 12:00 PM. Wear sneakers, bring a drink and your paddle. We have extra paddles and balls for you to use. Join us to play or to watch. We look forward to seeing you!

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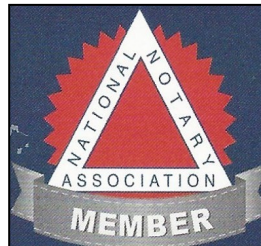
